FAITHFULNESS.

This week has presented two examples of faithfulness that are encouraging and inspiring. Faithfulness is most notably a trait of God. Throughout the Psalms, David highlights the faithfulness of God, using words like enduring and steadfast. "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good. *His love endures forever"* (Ps 136:1). God faithfully extends and assures us of His great love for us. I John 1:9 describes God as faithful in His forgiveness. While we often struggle to forgive, God faithfully forgives us as we confess that need.

Galatians 5 includes faithfulness in the fruit of the Spirit, and this week I am reminded of this trait within God's people. The Deacons have continued to meet as needed to count the offerings given. While this season in our lives has been fraught with uncertainty, the Deacons have recorded and reported that the giving remains consistent and generous. This is faithfulness. I am encouraged by the faithful giving of this body of believers, especially during a time characterized by financial and all kinds of uncertainly.

The other example of faithfulness this week is that of a specific individual. A man faithful in service to God for nearly 50 years, Ravi Zacharias was born and raised in India, encountered Christ as a confused and suicidal teen, and from that point, he never looked back. He was faithful in proclaiming the Good News of God's glory and grace until his death on Tuesday. He was 74. Ravi's intellect and God's plan paved the way for Ravi to speak before kings, in nearly every country, and on campuses the world over.

These two, you and Ravi, are examples of faithfulness and are a great source of encouragement to me! May the grace and peace of our Lord be with you.



ADOPT A HIGHWAY

Bethany recently renewed its Adopt a Highway segment on Hwy 23 near Priam. We have two miles of road ditch that we are responsible for maintaining and the expectation is that we will do this twice a year. Adopt a Highway was shut down until May 18, but ditch picks can resume statewide now that the Stay at Home Order has expired. Participants have a brief training before, and are expected to maintain some basic guidelines during the pick. Participants must be 12 years of age or older. Minors through age 17 are required to have parental consent. Forms will be provided to those who sign up. Currently, groups of 10 or less are permitted to go out. Yes, you read that right! The Leadership Committee has decided that the first Sunday in June will be our first opportunity to return to in person gatherings. This date of course is "penciled in." If there are any new developments that would call a return gathering into question, Leadership will consider pushing the date back. By June 7, we will have had nearly three weeks to become more comfortable with easing back toward a sense of normalcy and the state will have undoubtedly continued the movement of dials toward resuming normal social interactions.

Online services, such as Facebook Livestream will continue to be available. Those who are sick must stay home and those who remain at higher risk in any way are strongly encouraged to remain home and enjoy services online. Attendance, as always, is optional. Commonsense social distance & interactions will be the expectation of our return. For the first few weeks, we will likely refrain from congregational singing, hand shaking, passing offering plates, communion, children gathering up front, and the like. There will be limited access to hallways, rooms, etc. and no social gathering in the Hub after the service. Sanitizer stations will be provided and for those wearing masks, please bring one with you from home. Masks are encouraged, but the church will not be providing masks. Sanitizing and cleaning of high traffic areas will be increased.
